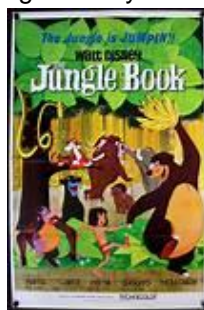
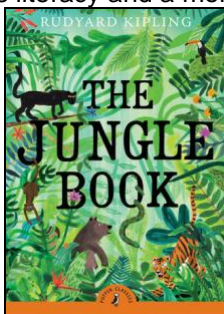

“Read the Book, See the Movie”™ (RBSM)

Promotes literacy and a more thoughtful way to view a film



The Jungle Book by Rudyard Kipling

The story of the man-cub “Mowgli” raised by wolves in the Indian jungle. Guided by mentors “Baloo” the bear, “Bagheera” the black panther, and the ancient python “Koa” Mowgli confronts his nemesis “Shere Khan” the tiger in one of the greatest literary tomes ever created that explores some of the deeper themes of the human-adult world: Dishonesty and suspicion, murder and revenge, friendship and loyalty. Mowgli’s adventures are juxtaposed with other animal stories ranging from the heroic battle of “Rikki-tikki-tavi” to the drama of survival in “The White Seal.” The author drew on ancient beast fables, Buddhist philosophy and memories of his Anglo-Indian upbringing to create a rich, symbolic portrait of man and nature. The RBSM promotes literacy and a more thoughtful way to view a film and also educate the readers about the cinematic arts.

A student from each participating school is invited to read one of Kipling’s poems from the book on stage at WGT.
